A BILL

intituled

An Act to consolidate the law relating to statutory declarations.

BE IT ENACTED by the Duli Yang Maha Mulia Seri Paduka Baginda Yang di-Pertuan Agong with the advice and consent of the Dewan Negara and Dewan Ra'avat in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Statutory Declarations short title.
- 2. It shall be lawful for any President of a Sessions Form of Court, Magistrate or Commissioner for Oaths appointed Declaration. under the Commissioner for Oaths Ordinance, 1947, to take M.U. 46 of and receive the declaration of any person voluntarily 1947. making the same in Malay or English in the Form A in the Schedule to this Ordinance.

3. Declarations made by virtue of the provisions of this False Act shall be deemed to be such declarations as are referred declaration to in Sections 199 and 200 of the Penal Code.

punishable under Penal

4. A person making any declaration by virtue of the Fees. provisions of this Act shall pay to the officer or Commissioner taking the same such fees as the Minister charged with the responsibility for the administration of justice may from time to time by notification in the Gazette prescribe.

5. The Statutory Declarations Act, 1835, of the United Repeal. Kingdom, in so far as it applies to the States of Malacca and Penang, and the Statutory Declarations Ordinance, 49 of 1949, 1949, are hereby repealed and the Statutory Declarations 5 & 6 Act, 1835, of the United Kingdom shall cease to apply to c. 62. Malacca and Penang.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

trate or Commissioner for Oaths)

The provisions of the Statutory Declarations Ordinance, 1949, in force in the former Malay States, and the provisions of the Statutory Declarations Act, 1835, of the United Kingdom in force in Malacca and Penang are identical.

The above Bill consolidates the law relating to statutory declarations but, apart from repealing the Statutory Declarations Act, 1835, of the United Kingdom, insofar as it applies to Malacca and Penang does not alter the existing law, except that the form of declaration is now prescribed in romanised Malay, as well as in English.
